

## 2 buildings on recent tour rented

SPRUCE PINE – At least two of the available properties in downtown Spruce Pine toured by artists and entrepreneurs are no longer available.

Spruce Pine Main Street Executive Director Libby Phillips said the Wildflowers building at 297 Oak Ave. and the Foxfire Restaurant space at 159 Locust St., more recently J-Rod's, are no longer available.

Wildflowers has been rented by Kimberly Hageman, owner and operator of Poppy's Wildcraft, an organic herb and herbal products business. The Foxfire space will soon be the new home of The Grove Church.

Poppy's Wildcraft products are currently available online and Hageman plans to open the retail shop in June.

Members of The Grove Church are currently renovating its new space. An announcement on the church's website says work parties at the location begin at 9 a.m. Saturdays.

The Grove pastor Zack Mason founded the church in March of 2016.
